

Implement a Tiered Framework of Supports



Resources and Technical Assistance for Implementation

Note: The terms Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) and Response to Intervention (RtI) are frequently used interchangeably and many resources on RtI cover concepts important to developing MTSS. The resources below include academic, behavioral, and social emotional interventions that help to prevent school failure. These interventions can be organized into tiers (or levels of support) that increase the likelihood of students graduating from school with a diploma.

Goss, C.L. & Andren, K.J. (2014). *Dropout Prevention*. Guilford Press.

With an emphasis on multi-tiered systems of support such as response to intervention, the authors provide an action plan to stop student disengagement from learning, which can start as early as elementary school. The book identifies critical measurable indicators of dropout risk and offers evidence-based practices to reduce risk at both the elementary and secondary levels.

McIntosh, K. & Goodman, S. (2016) *Integrated Multi-Tiered Systems of Support: Blending RTI and PBIS*. The Guilford Press. New York. NY.

This book provides keys to making RtI and PBIS more effective, seamless, efficient and sustainable by combining them into a single multi-tiered system of support. Steps and strategies are outlined for integrating data structures, practices, teams, and district system and includes reproducible checklists and evaluation tools.
