Serve as a Minnesota Alliance With Youth AmeriCorps Promise Fellow or VISTA Member

Nearly 1 in 5 Minnesota high school students did not graduate on time in 2016. Those who do not graduate are disproportionately lower-income students and students of color. Dropping out of school is a process, not a one-day event, and often has multiple causes. Students leaving high school often cite lack of motivation, boredom, an unchallenging atmosphere, or an overall lack of engagement in school as reasons they dropped out*. Minnesota Alliance With Youth **AmeriCorps Promise Fellows** and **VISTA Members** serve at schools, community based organizations, and nonprofits to provide the additional direct service or capacity building services needed to intervene early to reverse the trajectory of dropping out.

*VISTA Members may elect to receive an end of service stipend of \$1,800 or the education award. AmeriCorps Members may only earn the total value of two full-time education awards

**VISTA Members receive up to \$6,600 in a healthcare allowance plan for out of pocket health care costs

Do I meet the minimum qualifications?

Each site may have its own qualifications to serve, but the minimum qualifications to serve as an AmeriCorps Promise Fellow or a VISTA with the Minnesota Alliance With Youth include:

- Have a high school diploma or GED by the start date
- Be at least 18 years of age or older by the start date
- Be a citizen, national, or lawful permanent resident alien of the United States
 - VISTAs may hold the following legal residency classifications: refugee, asylum or asylee, temporary protected status or deferred action for childhood arrivals (DACA) status.
- Successfully pass background checks
- Have an interest in mentoring, working with youth, and educational equity
- Additional qualifications may be required depending on position
